INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Committee of the Auckland Ice Hockey Association Incorporated

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying annual report of the Auckland Ice Hockey Association Incorporated (the Society) on pages 6 to 13, which comprises the entity information, the statement of service performance, the statement of financial performance for the year ended 31 October 2022, the statement of financial position as at 31 October 2022 and the statement of accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion:

- a) the reported outcomes and outputs, and quantification of the outputs to the extent practicable, in the statement of service performance are suitable;
- b) the annual report on pages 6 to 13 presents fairly, in all material respects:
 - the entity information for the year then ended;
 - the service performance for the year then ended; and
 - the financial position of the Society as at 31 October 2022 and its financial performance, and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting Accrual (Not-For-Profit).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit of the financial statements in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand) (ISAs (NZ)). We conducted our audit of the entity information and statement of service performance in accordance with the International Standard on Assurance Engagements (New Zealand) ISAE (NZ) 3000 (Revised). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Annual Report section of our report.

We are independent of the Society in accordance with Professional and Ethical Standard 1 (Revised) Code of Ethics for Assurance Practitioners issued by the New Zealand Auditing and Assurance Standards Board, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Other than in our capacity as auditor we have not relationship with, or interests in the Society.

Emphasis of Matter

We draw the readers attention to Statement of Financial Position that shows assets exceed liabilities by \$8,060. The organisation is reliant on its members to provide funding and support into the future to ensure the going concern assumption is met.

Statement of Service Performance

Auckland Ice Hockey Association Incorporated For the year ended 31 October 2022

Auckland Ice Hockey's purpose is to organise, promote and grow the sport of ice hockey in Auckland making it accessible to all ages and skill levels. We arrange and manage competition matches within our club, along with representative teams under the rules adopted by the Auckland Ice Hockey Association, the New Zealand Ice Hockey Federation and the International Ice Hockey Federation with a strong focus on fair play and respect.

- Facilitate ice hockey games for members
- Facilitate ice hockey trainings for Learn To Play and Junior Members
- Support learn to play members to be able to feed into our leagues and grow our sport
- Represent Auckland ice hockey at a national level at New Zealand Ice Hockey Federation Tournaments

Description of Entity's Outcomes

Increase the numbers playing ice hockey in Auckland by providing opportunities to learn to play and games for differing ages and skill levels.

In 2022 season we had 44 females and 164 males learn to play compared to 2021 with 32 females and 145 males learning to play.

Junior players aged 20 and under has increased with 212 in 2022 and 187 in 2021.

Senior players was down by 22 compared to 2021.

Overall though players have increased in the last 4 years.

It has been challenging meeting the changing environment created by Covid. The ice rinks were closed during lockdowns. When ice rinks re-opened, gathering restrictions lead to further cancellations of games and restricted attendance at trainings. Despite this, we had minimal impact on our membership and we look forward to completing our planned ice hockey season for 2022.

Statement of Accounting Policies

Auckland Ice Hockey Association Incorporated For the year ended 31 October 2022

Basis of Preparation

The entity has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous reporting period.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at their estimated net realisable value.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

Grants & Donations

Grants and donations will be treated a income when received.

Income Tax

Auckland Ice Hockey Association Inc is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

6. Commitments & Contingencies

There are no known commitments or contingent liabilities at year end (2021 \$nil).

7. Related Parties

Multiple Board members have family/children playing ice hockey. Board members also participate in ice hockey as players, coaches, officials, team managers and admin. They regularly provide their time and skills at no charge due to the volunteer nature of the organisation. CGM Consultancy Ltd is owned by Carl McIntyre and employs Michael Domigan. CGM Consultancy invoices AIHA for reimbursement of Michaels hours and ice hockey jerseys purchased (if any) for amounts less than normal business terms. For the 2022 financials year the following related party transactions were: Expenditure with CGM consultancy \$61,792.77 for Jerseys, Facebook and Michael, and amounts owed \$113.85.

8. Events after the Balance date

In January 2022, New Zealand was placed in a Red Light Covid control programme. This is due to the arrival of a new variant of the virus and the impact of this is unable to be estimated. However, this situation does allow for restricted activities and sporting events but with limited capacity for spectators.

9. Ability to Continue Operating

The entity will continue to operate for the foreseeable future.
